

fathers teach their children to call them by their actual name? Not many.

If we were to carefully study the Bible to find whether God has a preference as to how we, His children, should address Him, we would discover that God has a parental heart much like our own hearts, and would like for us to refer to Him as “Father,” “Dad,” or even “Papa” or “Daddy.” As Jesus and his apostles walked toward the Garden of Gethsemane, they stopped on the way, and Jesus prayed as follows:

These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee: (John 17:1).

Jesus uses the name “father” five more times (verses 5, 11, 21, 24, and 25) in this prayer, and also said these words:

And I have declared unto them [the apostles] thy name, and will declare it: (John 17:26a).

It is obvious the name Jesus declared was “Father,” not Jehovah, because both Peter and John, who were with Jesus during His prayer, later wrote:

And if ye call on the Father, who without respect of persons judgeth according to every man's work, pass the time of your sojourning *here* in fear . . . (I Peter 1:17).

(For the life was manifested, and we have seen *it*, and bear witness, and shew unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us;) (I John 1:2).

The small Epistle of James refers to God as “Father” three times (James 1:17; 1:27 and 3:9). Even the tiny Epistle of Jude, only twenty-five verses in length, refers to God as “Father” (verse 1).

God also directs the Apostle Paul to reinforce this Holy Paternalism:

For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. (Romans 8:15).

And because ye are sons, God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts, crying, Abba, Father. (Galatians 4:6).

Abba is a familiar name, not unlike Papa, children endearingly call their Dad. (Jesus

We all need help to understand the Bible, and we cannot find the scriptural guidance we need outside the ‘faithful and discreet slave’ organization. (The Watchtower, February 15, 1981, p.19).

Unless we are in touch with this channel of communication that God is using, we will not progress along the road to life, no matter how much Bible reading we do. (The Watchtower; December 1, 1981, p.27).

They say that it is sufficient to read the Bible exclusively, either alone or in small groups at home. But, strangely, through such ‘Bible reading,’ they have reverted right back to the apostate doctrines that commentaries by Christendom’s clergy were teaching 100 years ago . . . (The Watchtower, August 15, 1981; p. 29).
