If You Were to Die Today, Would Heaven Be Your Home?

It is not necessary to wait until you die to find out where you will spend eternity. The Bible says that you can know right now whether or not you have eternal life:

These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God. (I John 5:13 emphasis added).

The first thing everyone must understand is that no one deserves to go to Heaven because according to the Bible:

As it is written, There is none righteous, no not one . . . (Romans 3:10).

The reason why we aren't righteous is because:

For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God. (Romans 3:23).

No matter how hard we try, we will always fall short of God's glory because of our sin. And there are consequences for our sin:

For the wages of sin is death . . . (Romans 6:23a).

The death that the Bible mentions here is spiritual death, eternal separation from God; it is the penalty for our sins. But we are not without hope:

. . . but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. (Romans 6:23b).

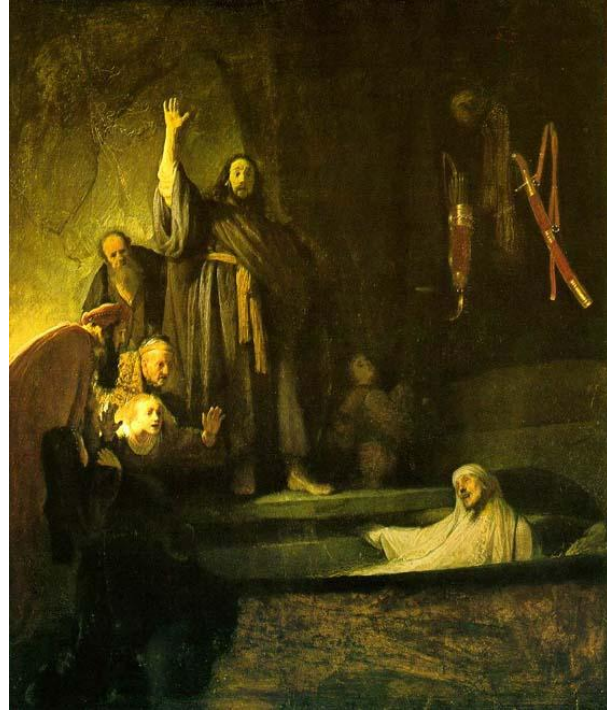
A gift is not something that you earn or work for: it is given to you as a free of charge.
